Five ways to save energy using a programmable thermostat

Heating and cooling can account for up to 60 per cent of your home's energy use. That's a lot of energy - more than lighting, appliances and water heating combined!

A properly set programmable thermostat can help manage this energy use and save you up to 10 per cent, or even more, on heating and cooling costs.

To help reap the maximum energy savings from your programmable



thermostat consider the following:

- > During the winter, set your thermostat to 20°C when you're at home and 18°C when sleeping or away.
- > It's best to install the thermostat on an interior wall where there are no vents or drafts and away from fireplaces, heat-generating appliances or direct sunlight.
- > When on vacation, lower your

thermostat settings and keep it at a constant temperature. Some thermostats allow you to control your settings online. This allows you to remotely set your thermostat to be at your preferred temperature by the time you get home.

- > Try not to override your settings. This costs you money. Instead, cozy up in blankets, sweaters and slippers before turning up the heat.
- Set your fan switch to "automatic" instead of "on" or "continuous".

There are many programmable thermostats on the market that can help you manage energy use. For homes with central air conditioning, Hydro Ottawa customers are eligible to receive a free programmable thermostat as part of the saveONenergy **peaksaver PLUS*** program.
